

44 answered this question 4 skipped



- Dabbled for years, only began putting time behind in the last fine.


### **Popular Mediums**



There are a number of mediums represented by our group, with the majority working in Acrylic, but this does not limit them to just the one medium, if they had other interests these were included in the above graph.


### Do you work in a home studio?

Yes 33.33% 16 32 No 66.67%




